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## II. Key Issues:

### 8. Summary:

This is a pilot experiment based on a partnership between UNIFEM and the Government of Senegal with the aim of establishing mechanisms to incorporate gender sensitivity into the Ministry of Agriculture's programmes and budgets. The innovation starts by assessing the ministry's policies and programmes in order to identify the level of gender integration and make recommendations for better incorporation of the gender dimension by designing appropriate tools, an exercise entailing the following steps:

- Boosting of the capacities of ministry staff through ongoing support and advice with regard to gender sensitive budgeting in each stage of planning and budgeting:
  - Support for formulation of a medium-term sector expenditure framework to ensure a good incorporation of gender into its objectives;
  - Formulation of certain gender-sensitive strategic objectives and programme indicators during a medium-term sector expenditure framework workshop;
- Support for a review of the National Agricultural Development Programme;
- Review of programmes and budget programmes in a gender-sensitive perspective;
- Formulation of future medium-term sector expenditure frameworks.

### 9. What issue does the innovation address?

- The strong trend towards the feminization of poverty in rural areas and the unequal access of men and women to resources, resulting from a failure to take the gender dimension into account in agricultural-sector policies and programmes
- Under-exploitation of the huge potential of the main actors in the agricultural sector
- Unequal distribution of the sector's resources between men and women, which is contrary to the Government of Senegal's undertakings with regard to gender equality
- Sectoral ministries' staff's lack of expertise regarding the implementation of programmes and projects that incorporate equal opportunity principles for men and women farmers as regards access to inputs, processing and integration into the commercial market.

### 10. Key success factors for replication:

- Commitment of actors and partners
- Political will of policy-makers
- Budget reforms under way
